Dear Hamilton Families.

Welcome to the March Edition of the Wildcat Chronicles! We have decided to re-enter our building and serve our students who have opted for in-person learning while continuing virtual instruction. In order to prepare for a safe return, I would like to provide a several significant updates in order to prepare our students for success. Beginning March 1, 2021, the school bell times for both in-person and virtual learning bell times will be &15am - 315pm Classroominstruction will occur parallel to distance and in-person learning, with social distancing when feasible. Teachers will continue to use Microsoft TEAMS for all instruction.

Students attending in-person instruction may enter the building at 8.00am and are expected on campus no earlier than 7.55am Kindergarten – 2^{rd} Grade will enter the through the Main Entrance. Grades 3-5 will enter through Door #1 and Door #2/Rag Pole entrance for student in Grades 6-8. Each location will be clearly marked for easy access.

We will be adhering to our school dress code policy and a new cell phone policy. Please see the Dress Code Policy and Cell Phone Policy section of this newsletter and our school website for more information.

For students returning to in-person instruction, temperatures will be taken by school personnel prior to students entering the building. Students found to have an elevated temperature (above 100.4) upon first reading will undergo a second reading before being sent to the Safety Room. If your student has a temperature and/or Oxid-19 symptoms, please keep themat home. If symptoms are developed while at school. We will promptly contact you to pick up your student from school.

Hamilton K-8 School Uniform Policy

******All in person learners will be required to follow the SCS Board Policy on Uniforms.*****

No hats or head coverings will be worn inside the building unless approved by school administration.

Masks must be worn at all times. Masks must not display any words, pictures, or symbols that are inappropriate for school,

Bandanas NOT are permitted as mask.

Bandana like material are NOT permitted as mask.

Shirts-must have a collar

White Navy Blue Royal Blue Light Blue

Bottoms — All bottoms must be at least knee length

Black Navy Blue Khaki

Belts and Socks- Black Brown White

Shoes, must be a matching pair and shoestrings must match the shoes. All shoes must be closed-toed shoes must be closed toe and heel strap.

<u>Jackets</u>- A light jacket may be worn inside the building. Jackets must be of uniform colors or gray with no logos. <u>Hoodies</u>- Students may wear hoodies, but must remove hoods indoors.

<u>lewelry/Farrings</u> may be worn by males and/or females but should not be hanging long enough to be a potential hazard to the student's well-being. All costume jewelry must be silver, gold, or our uniform colors.

Grills may not be worn throughout the school day.

No bandanas may be worn and no bandana print items will be worn.

Hair color and styles may not be a distraction or interfere with the learning environment,
