Liberia with Optional scholars in **March**. Liberia began in the early 1800's as a project of the American Colonization Society. They

believed free black people would face better chances for freedom and prosperity in Africa rather than in the United States. Liberia



is Africa's first and oldest modern republic. It is among the few African countries to maintain its sovereignty during the scramble to control/rule Africa.



Scholars tasted Fufu from Bala's Bistro (4571 Elvis Presley Blvd, Memphis, TN 38116). Fufu (or foofoo or foufou) is a common west African "swallow" food. It is usually served as a side dish. We also tasted

ginger beer. Liberian Ginger Beer is a non-

alcoholic beverage made with ginger, pineapple and lemon for a healthy, zesty and tasteful drink.
