"Excellence In Action" has emanated from E.E. Jeter since it was erected in 1922. Named for Emmett Early Jeter, the school was officially dedicated in 1923 by Senator Estes McKellar. One of the oldest schools in Shelby County, E.E. Jeter is nestled in the heart of Shelby Forest. The school originally opened for students in grades one through eleven; was restructured in the late 1920s for grades one through eight; kindergarten was added in 1972; and remained unchanged until 2014 when it became the kindergarten through eighth grade it is now.

The E.E. Jeter community is steeped in tradition and history. Many students in attendance are third or forth generation Jeter Jets. It is non-transitional but draws many transfers due to its reputation for academic excellence.
