



My child has been exposed to COVID-19. What happens next?

KEEP YOUR CHILD AT HOME IF...

- Your child has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Your child has had contact with someone who is positive for COVID-19.
- Your child has been told to stay out of school by the Shelby County Health Department (SCHD), SCS Contact Tracing Team, or your child's principal.

WHEN CAN HE/SHE RETURN?

- If a student tests positive for COVID-19, he/she will not be permitted to return to the school building until the specific number of days required by the CDC/Health Department has been met, even if they do not develop symptoms.
- Once the specified time period is over, these individuals may return to school with documentation of clearance.
- For additional questions, contact your child's school.

ACADEMIC INSTRUCTION

- If students are not permitted to return to the school building or when schools are closed, students will participate in **virtual asynchronous learning** (independent study).
- In some cases, additional academic arrangements may be necessary.

STOP THE SPREAD OF GERMS



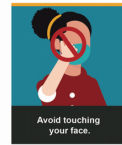
Stay at least 6 feet apart from others.

Stay home when you are sick, except to get medical care.

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VISITOR GUIDELINES



Please do not enter
if any of the following apply to you:

- Have a fever, cough or shortness of breath
- Known exposure to someone diagnosed with COVID-19
- Have travelled internationally in the last 14 days

ADDITIONAL GUIDANCE FOR FAMILIES

- If your child is out of school due to illness, please notify the school.
- Parents should keep their contact information up-to-date with their schools to ensure they receive notifications.
- Monitoring student symptoms, wearing of masks, social distancing when possible, frequent washing of hands, the use of sanitizer, and cleaning protocols will all reduce the chances of COVID-19 passing from one person to another.



Mi hijo ha estado expuesto al COVID-19. ¿Qué pasa después?

MANTENGA A SU HIJO EN CASA SI

- Su hijo salió positivo en la prueba de COVID-19.
- Su hijo ha tenido contacto con alguien que dio positivo para COVID-19.
- El Departamento de Salud del Condado de Shelby (SCHD), el Equipo de Rastreo de Contactos de SCS o el director de su hijo le han dicho a su hijo que no asista a la escuela.

¿CUÁNDO PUEDE REGRESAR?

- Si un estudiante da positivo por COVID-19, no se le permitirá regresar al edificio de la escuela hasta que se haya cumplido la cantidad específica de días requeridos por el CDC / Departamento de Salud, incluso si no presenta síntomas.
- Una vez que finaliza el período de tiempo especificado, estas personas pueden regresar a la escuela con la documentación de autorización.
- Si tiene preguntas adicionales, comuníquese con la escuela de su hijo.

INSTRUCCIÓN ACADÉMICA

- Si a los estudiantes no se les permite regresar al edificio de la escuela o cuando las escuelas están cerradas, los estudiantes participarán en **el aprendizaje virtual asincrónico** (estudio independiente).
- En algunos casos, pueden ser necesarios arreglos académicos adicionales.

ORIENTACIÓN ADICIONAL PARA LAS FAMILIAS

- Si su hijo (a) está fuera de la escuela debido a una enfermedad, notifique a la escuela.
- Los padres deben mantener actualizada su información de contacto con sus escuelas para asegurarse de recibir notificaciones.
- El seguimiento de los síntomas de los estudiantes, el uso de máscaras, el distanciamiento social cuando sea posible, el lavado frecuente de manos, el uso de desinfectantes y los protocolos de limpieza reducirán las posibilidades de que el COVID-19 pase de una persona a otra.

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
