Being a Title I school means receiving federal funding (Title I dollars) to supplement the school's existing programs.

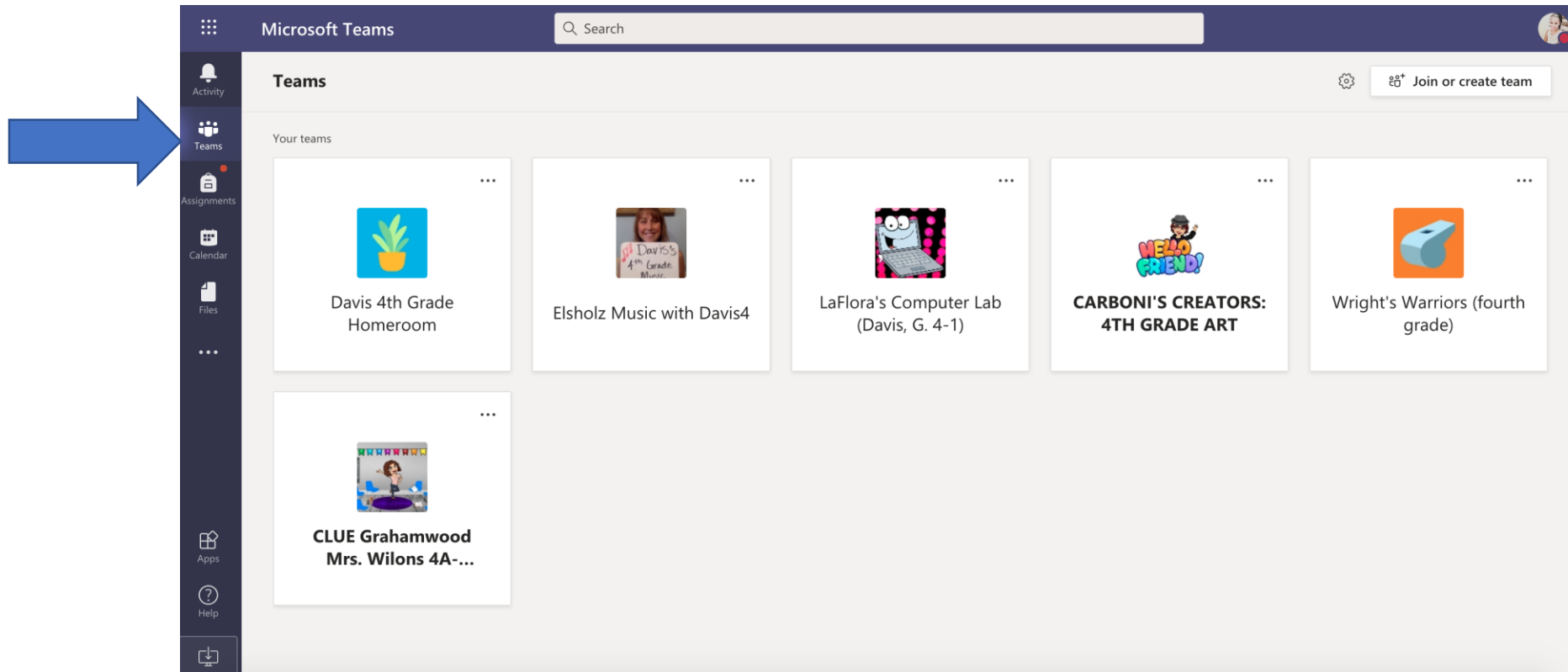
These dollars are used for...

- Recruiting/Hiring/Retaining Highly Qualified Teachers

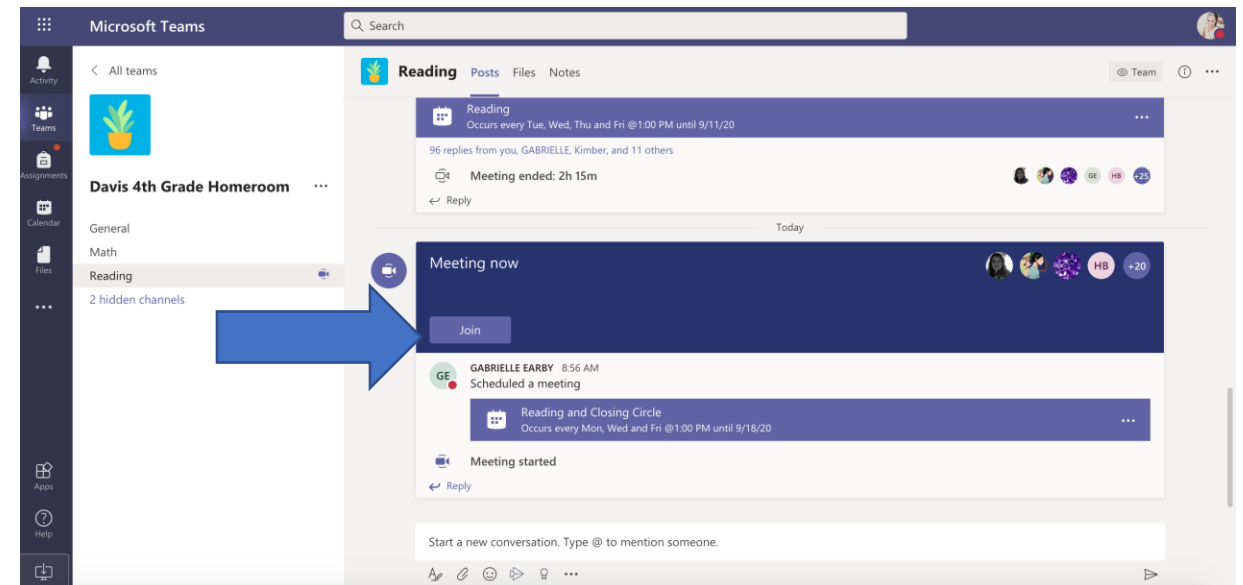
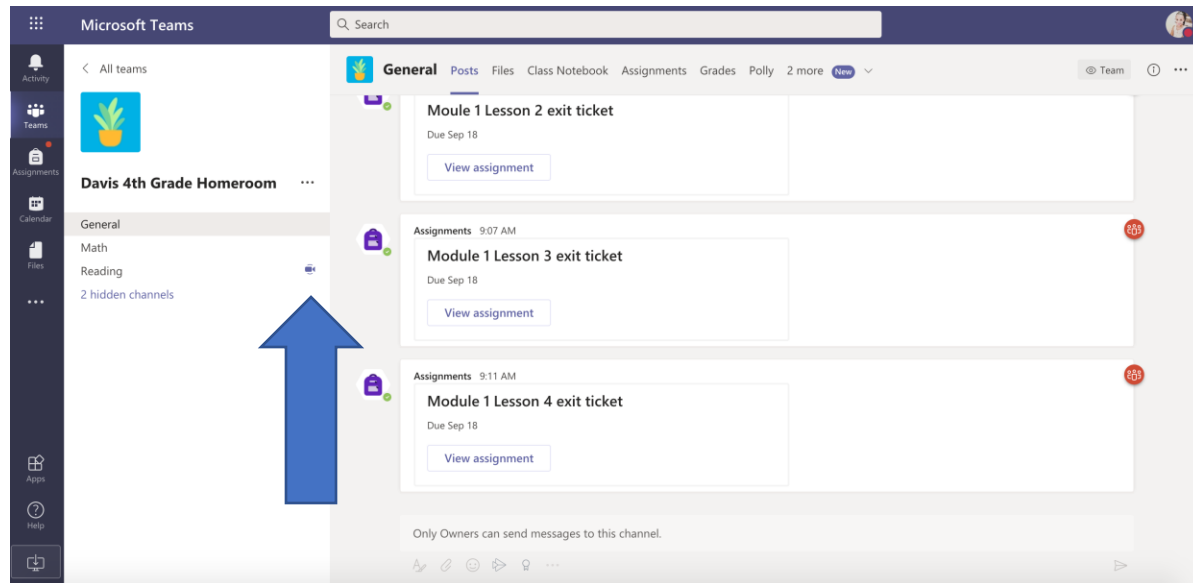
Navigating TEAMS



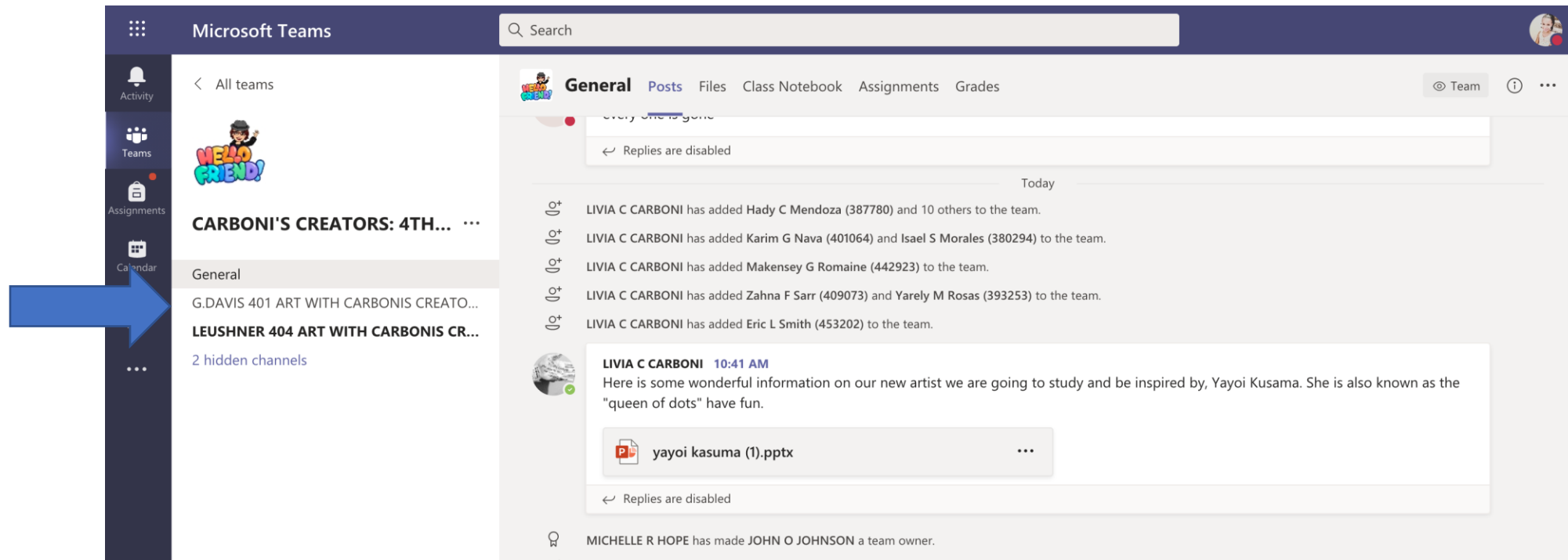
- When you power on your tablet, you will see the TEAMS icon on the desktop. Double click.
- Your TEAMS will then appear (sometimes it shows the last screen you were on. Click "teams" down the side or "view all teams" at the top to navigate to the home screen.



- Click on your Homeroom TEAM. A little video camera should show on the side next to the name of the channel where the meeting is. Click on the channel and "join."



- Students in K-2 do not have to leave their homeroom TEAM unless they receive pull out services (CLUE, SPED, ESL).
- Students in 3-5 leave their TEAM to join special subjects. For this, just click on that teacher's name, and then (if applicable) their homeroom teacher's name.



TEAMS Etiquette

Students

- Should remain muted unless asked to unmute
- Should have their cameras on
- Should not get up from the camera unless it is a break
- Should use features responsibly (not muting others, removing them from the meeting, not chatting inappropriately, etc.)

Parents

- Should remain close to help with technology issues
- Should refrain from attempting to speak to the teacher or other students
- Should not assist students with assignments/tests (by giving answers etc.). If your student needs help, remind them to raise their hand to ask the teacher.

Your @Home School Space

- Create a "special" learning space for your child to do schoolwork. If there are multiple siblings, separate the workspaces to maximize privacy. Student should not be lounging on the couch or in their bed.
- Ensure that the workspace is clutter free and stocked with the necessary school supplies.
- Ensure that the workspace is quiet and free from distractions.
- Check to make sure your child's device is near an electrical outlet to keep the device powered.
- Ensure that seating is comfortable and there's plenty of lighting.

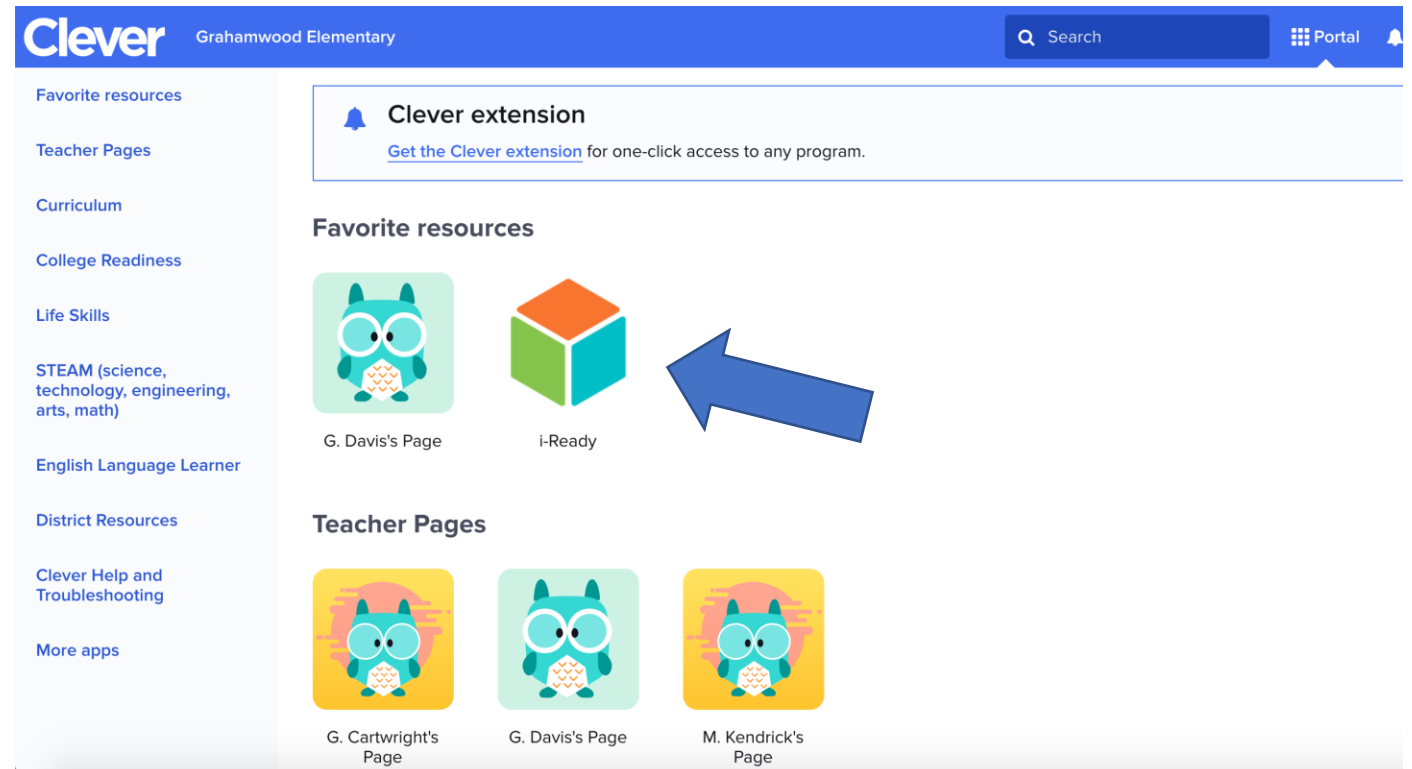

- You should be signed in, but if not, sign in with the same credentials as on the tablet.
- Then click "iReady"

A Note: Attendance & Absences

- Students are expected to be present for the entire school day.
- Attendance will be formally recorded in Powerschool.
- Attendance will be taken in each block (i.e. Reading, Math, Social Studies, Support).
- If your student is not present for the whole day, they will be coded as Tardy or as having an Early Check Out.
- Excessive absences will be flagged and turned over to the school guidance team, the district attendance TEAM, and the truancy office.
- In order to excuse your absence, please email a note to your child's homeroom teacher.

Troubleshooting

I can't see/hear my teacher (but everyone else can)!

Sign out by clicking your initials and clicking "sign out." Then shut down your device completely.

It is hard to use the features on the K-2 tablet

Some of the features will be easier if you use a mouse. You can purchase a bluetooth mouse or a USB-C port mouse for around \$10.

I'm stuck in the lobby!

Leave the meeting, sign out of TEAMS (See above) and try again. You can also message your teacher on dojo to let them know.
