All AP Exams are scored on a 5-point scale. These scores are used to assess student success in the course but are NOT tied to student course letter grades. Students take the AP Exam in early to mid-May and receive their scores from College Board in July.

<u>Course Description</u>: AP Japanese Language and Culture course is designed to be comparable to college/university Japanese courses that represent the point at which students complete approximately 300 hours of college-level classroom instruction. Like the corresponding college courses, the AP course supports students as they develop the productive, receptive, and cultural skills necessary to communicate with native speakers of Japanese. Student's proficiency level at the end of the course are expected to reach at least Intermediate Low to Intermediate Mid-range, as described in the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) Proficiency Guidelines.

*NOTE: Acceptance into AP Japanese requires an in-person interview with Lira Sensei during application time. Prerequisite: Completion of at least Level 3 Honors.
