# WHAT IS TITLE 1?



- Title I is the largest federal aid program for our nation's schools.
- The goal of Title I is to provide a high-quality education for every child.
- Title I resources are directed to schools with high poverty levels.
- Title I program serves millions of children in elementary and secondary schools each year.
- Shelby County Schools has roughly 190 schools operating under the Title I program.

# What does it mean to be a Title I School?



- Being a Title I school means receiving federal funding (Title I dollars) to supplement the school's existing programs.
- These dollars are used for...
  - Identifying students experiencing academic difficulties and providing timely assistance to help these student's meet the State's challenging content standards.
  - Purchasing supplemental staff/programs/materials/supplies
  - Conducting parental Involvement meetings/trainings/activities
  - Recruiting/Hiring/Retaining Highly Qualified Teachers

# Our School Achievement Data



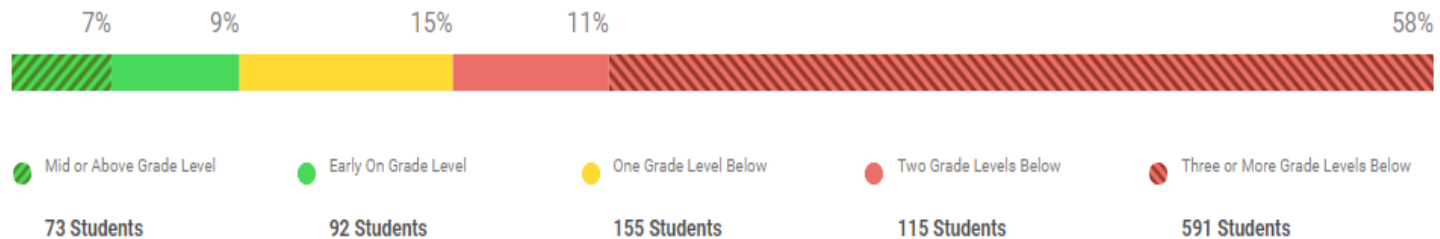
- Our Mastery Connect data from the 2020-2021 school year was used to develop the goals and strategies in the School Improvement Process.

# FALL - iReady Data

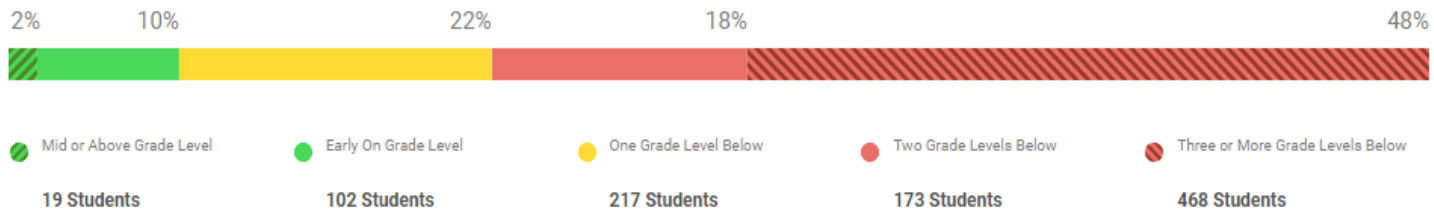

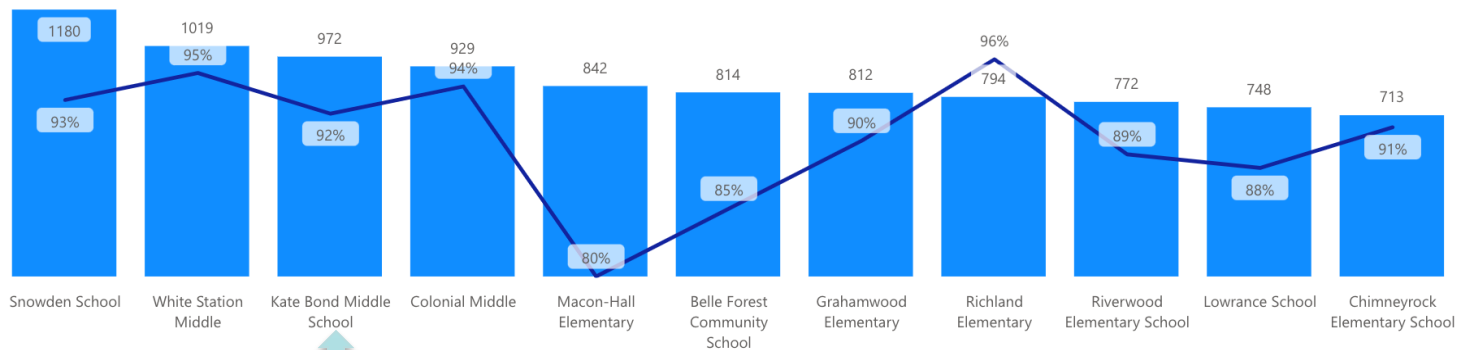

# IReady #Completion Top 10 Reading and Math

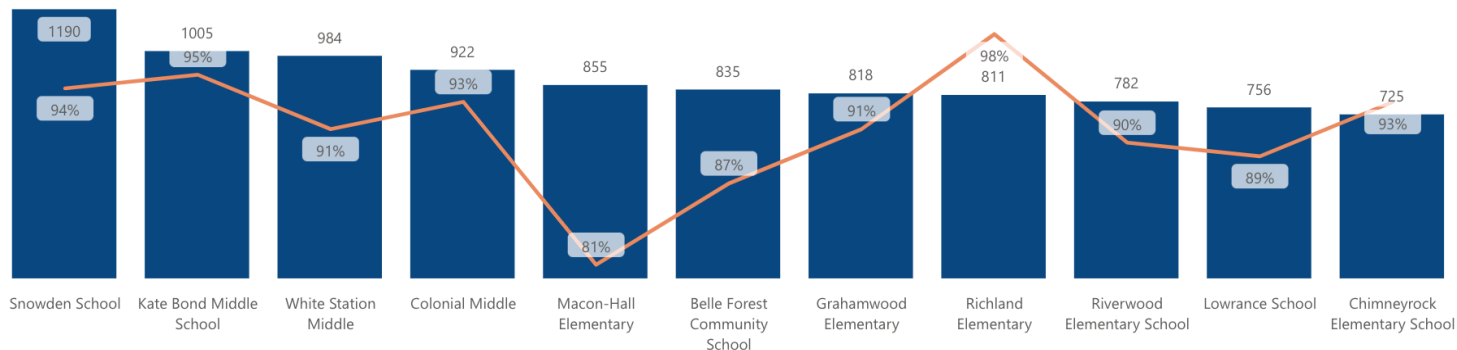
IReady Math #Completed Top 10 Schools

Kate Bond Middle school has the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest completion rate for Reading with 95%. The completion rate for Math was 92%.

# School Improvement Plan



The **SIP** is a *‘road map or unique plan’*, refined annually, that defines a school’s targeted work to raise achievement for all of its students.

## Our School’s Goals for 2021-2022

Increase the ELA, Math, & S. Studies scores by 5 pts.

ELA – 19.0% to **24.0%**

Math – 18.9% to **23.9%**

Social Studies – 27.5% to **32.5%**



# Parents' Right to Know



- Parents have the right to request and receive timely information regarding the professional qualifications of their teachers and paraprofessionals.
- Parents must be notified if their child is assigned to, or taught, for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who does not meet state certification requirements for the grade level or subject area taught.
- Parents should be provided information regarding the level of achievement of their child on State required academic assessments.
- To that extent that it is feasible, information must be in a language that parents can understand.

# TEACHER QUALIFICATIONS



Teachers are considered *'highly qualified'* under the ESSA ACT if they demonstrate subject knowledge in the core content areas, hold at least a bachelor's degree, and have been issued a license from the State Department of Education.

**All teachers at Kate Bond Middle School are *'highly qualified'* teachers.**

# Kate Bond Middle School Engagement Plan



- **Kate Bond Middle School has a special responsibility to our parents and the community by providing opportunities for you to get involved and share the responsibility of promoting success in our children.**
- **To ensure that our parents participate in the development and implementation of the school's program, Kate Bond Middle School will do the following:**
