






This is not an exhaustive list of all of the opportunities available in Tennessee.

#### CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Small businesses can exist in any career cluster area and span a broad range of areas of specialty and expertise. Among the small businesses operated by entrepreneurs in Tennessee are auto body repair shops, massage therapy service establishments, landscaping and grounds maintenance businesses, funeral homes and related service establishments, auto service shops, hair and nail salons, construction contracting businesses, graphic designs shops, HVAC installation and repair shops, marriage and family therapy service organizations, and general maintenance/repair (handyman) service shops. In these specific areas of small business, opportunities for work are expected to increase at a rate of 9.1% through 2024.
