
## The Road to Success

Use to help you stay on track.	Each underlined word is a link. Also visit White Station's Counselor's Corner website for more information.		
August	Make a list of <u>colleges</u> that are a good fit you; 6 to 10 schools are a good number. <u>Military</u> is also a great option. Do your <u>research</u> .		
September	Next apply. Most colleges have an online application on their website; find the APPLY link or Freshman Application. Or you can also use Common APP, and HBCU APP, etc. There is a cost to apply. Fees range from \$25-75 dollars. Also, hope you have built a good relationship with your teachers because now is the time to ask for a recommendation.		
September	This year every student will use <b>Naviance</b> , a document sending platform. Your Naviance account will allow your counselor to send documents to the colleges on your college application list. To access Naviance, log into <b>Clever</b> and select the Naviance icon. <b>Note</b> : Naviance works with Common App and other colleges, it does not take the place of an application.		
Naviance	Instructions on how to add colleges to Naviance are in your Counselor's Team.		
Connect with your counselor	Turn in a copy of your résumé and personal statements to your counselor if recommendations are required. Note: If you are applying to 3 or less schools, you don't have to submit as much. Ask your counselor to help make that determination. Your counselor will write a recommendation, complete your school report and send off your official transcript through Naviance. Please allow a reasonable turn around for your counselor, at least 3 weeks.		
ACT	You are responsible for your ACT score getting to the college. Go to <u>ACT.org</u>		
October	Seniors may retake the <u>ACT</u> , if necessary. <b>Senior District ACT is October 3</b> . Studying and <u>practice</u> is the key. Seniors interested in the Military are encouraged to take the <u>ASVAB</u> exam. See you counselor for details.		
October - March	Complete the FAFSA. <u>FAFSA</u> opens October 1st. Your parents must be a part of this process. Deadline March 1		
Nov - April	Search for <u>scholarships</u> and grants. Good sources are TN Promise, <u>TN Promise</u> deadline is Nov, 1. <u>Ned McWherter</u> , Questbridge, <u>Local Chapters</u> and Greek organizations, your parents' employer, school's <u>senior REMIND</u> and Teams ect Eligible students will receive the <u>TN HOPE Scholarship</u> . Larger scholarships will come from the colleges' scholarship funds. Look on their websites.		
Jan - April	Wait for an acceptance letters or email. If you don't get what you want, reevaluate and apply to more colleges. Also consider the <u>IN Promise</u> . <u>IN Promise</u> is an opportunity to attend a <u>community</u> or <u>technical</u> college for free. <u>IN Promise</u> deadline is Nov, 1. 2023		
April - May	Turn in Scholarship Report and Final Transcript Request (more information to come). Attend graduation and have a happy life. ©
