In 2022-2023, English I had 62.8% of students score On-Track and Mastery on the End of Course exam and English II had 83.8% of students score On-Track and Master on the End of Course exam for a combined average of 74%. By the Spring of 2025, East High School has a goal of improving the percentage of students scoring On-Track and Mastery on the TNReady exam in English I from 62.8% in 2023 to 70% in 2025 and a goal of improving the percentage of students scoring On-Track and Mastery in English II from 83.8 in 2023 to 87% in the spring of 2025 on the TNReady exam for a combined score of 78.5% by the spring of 2025. We believe improvement in this area can build a base for proficiency levels for all students.

[G 2] Mathematics

In 2022-2023, Math had 34.7% of students who scored On-Track and Mastery on the End of Course exam. This included 34.4% of students scoring On-Track and Mastery in Algebra I, 15% of students scoring On-Track and Mastery and 61% of students scoring On-Track and Mastery in Algebra II. By Spring 2025, East High School has a goal of improving Algebra I scores to 45% of students scoring On-Track and Mastery, increasing Geometry scores to 30% and increasing Algebra II scores to 70%. These combined scores would bring the total number of math students scoring On-Track and Mastery to 48% in the spring of 2025. We believe improvements in these areas can build a base for proficiency levels for all students. The continual use of the new math curriculum material and rigorous professional development to support math teachers will continue to be implemented.
