What does participation in Title I programming mean?

Booker T. Washington Middle and High School is a Title school, with a school-wide Title program.

Title I, Part A (Title I) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESEA) provides financial assistance to local educational agencies (LEAs) and schools with high numbers or high percentages of children from low-income families to help ensure that all children meet challenging state academic standards.

School-wide Title | Program: Schools may consolidate and use funds under Title I, together with other federal, state, and local funds, when more than 40% of the student body receives free or reduced lunch.

- A teacher's baccalaureate and/or graduate degree, fields of endorsement, previous teaching experience
- A paraprofessional's qualifications
- An annual notice of Student Education Records Privacy and notice for disclosure of
- School Directory Information
- An assurance that their child's name, address and telephone listing not be released to military recruiters
- Parent trainings

ALL PARENTS WILL RECEIVE INFORMATION ON THE FOLLOWING:


- Their child's level of achievement on each of the state's academic assessments
- Notification of right to transfer their child to another school in the district if the student becomes the victim of a violent crime or is assigned to an unsafe school

In the event that your child is taught, 20 days or more, by a non-highly qualified teacher, you will receive a letter.




Parents' Right to Know...




