School Reminders

- Breakfast and Lunch are free. Students may bring their lunch if they choose to.
- Breakfast is from 7:30am - 8:00am.
- Morning Arrival - Kindergarten- 3rd grade students who come to school between 7:30am - 8:00 will report to the cafeteria to wait until one of the grade level teachers pick them up at 8am.
- Morning Arrival - 4th - 8th grade students who come to school between 7:30am - 8:00 am will report to the gymnasium to wait until one of their grade level teachers come to pick them up at 8am.
- 6th - 8th grade students will go through the metal detection daily.
- For dismissal of car riders, please do not get out of your car to walk up to the gym door. We will not be able to accommodate you and give you your child. Please stay in the line. The line will get

- Middle School numbers are on blue paper and Elementary are on white paper. Please put the numbers in your dash board when picking up your child.
- Please help your child to memorize their car rider numbers. It will help the car rider lines go faster.
- **Car Riders - Elementary Students and Middle School siblings are picked up in the gymnasium for dismissal.**
- **Car Riders - Middle School siblings and Middle School only children are picked up on the Tutwiler Alley.**
- If the car line takes too long for you, you may sign your child up as a walker and meet them at one of the Walk Stations: North Parkway, Faxon, or Tutwiler.
- **Early Check-Outs will end at 2:30pm daily. Please know that early check outs will count against student's Optional and General Choice Transfers.**

Uniform Policy

Parents, we are having trouble with students wearing plaids (skirts/vests), very short skirts (should be knee length) and non-uniform colored jackets and hoodies with large wording and logos. Please help us by ensuring that your child is in uniform compliance. See below.

Snowden School Uniform Policy

Tops

- Shirt colors are white, green, gray or black. All shirts must have a collar (polo or dress style). T-shirts worn under uniform shirts must be solid white.
- Boys' shirts are to be tucked in. Girls' shirts must be long enough to cover the waistline.
- Boys' and girls' shirts must be appropriately sized (not oversized or undersized).

Bottoms



pants, tights, or pants made of spandex or denim are prohibited).

- Shorts, skirts, or jumpers must be knee-length.
- Belts are to be the proper sized and put through the belt loops.

Jackets

- Jacket, sweater, sweat shirt, “hoodie”, and cardigan colors are to be white, green, gray or black, with no logo, lettering or design.
- Heavy coats, heavy jackets, and raincoats are not to be worn during the school day and must be stored in the student’s locker.

Shoes

- Shoes can have heels no higher than one and one-half inches.
- Athletic shoes, sandals with straps on the heel, and boots are permitted.
- Flip flops and slides are NOT permitted.

Other

Snowden Spirit Wear should only be worn on Fridays.

- Excessive, large, or flashy jewelry is not allowed. Any accessory items that distract from the learning process will not be allowed (i.e. large earrings, grills, bulky jewelry, non-prescription glasses, sunglasses).
- **Large handbags** and backpacks cannot be carried to and from class. These must be stored in the student locker or cloak room. Small handbags and string backpacks may be carried from class to class.

Note: Memphis Shelby County School Board policy prohibits PK-12 students from wearing any type of clothing, apparel or accessory that denotes gang membership or affiliation. Therefore, principals shall have the authority to place restrictions on the basic uniform for safety reasons.

Arrival and Dismissal

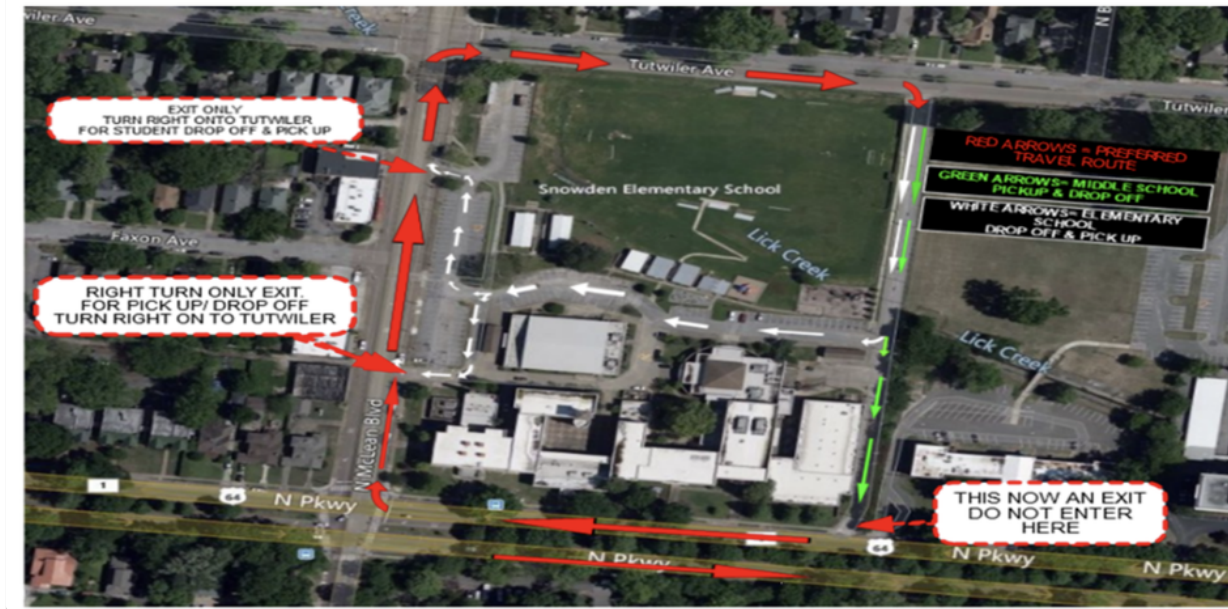
For morning arrival, students may be on campus as early as 7:30am. We utilize the Cafeteria as a waiting area for KK - 3rd students. We utilize the Gymnasium as a waiting area for 4th - 8th Grade students. All students may get their breakfast beginning at 7:30am. Breakfast and Lunch are free for all students. Breakfast ends at 8:10am. Students are picked up from their waiting areas by a grade level teacher from each location at 7:55 a.m. M-SCS Safety protocol requires that we utilize safety protocols daily such as Metal detectors and/or hand wands.

For dismissal, we have several transportation modes and it is very critical that your child know which one they will be using and if there are any special situations, the homeroom teacher must be notified. Just to reiterate them, we have Walkers (North Parkway, Faxon and Tutwiler), School Buses, Daycare Buses, MATA Buses, Car Riders and YMCA.

We will be using our Car Line system again on this year. We are asking for your patience again on this year for the first week of school as we will begin giving the students the car line numbers on the first day of school. For the first week, as you are in the car line, you will have to tell the teachers your child(ren) name(s) which causes the delay in the traffic moving fast. Please help your child (ren) learn their car line numbers as soon as they get them. It is imperative to the success of the Car Line



New MSCS Uniform Grading System:

The Shelby County Schools Board of Education voted to adopt a new 10-point grading scale for students enrolled in grades Pre-K through 12. This was done to align with the new state law uniform grading system.

The new MSCS grading scale will go into effect beginning with the 2022-2023 school year.

SEARCHES:

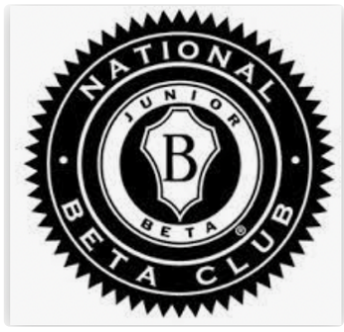

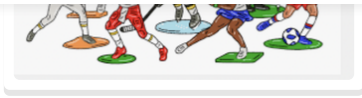
