Notice of Title I School-wide Program Status

What is Title I ?

- Title I refers to federal funding that our school receives under the **Elementary and Secondary School Act (ESEA)** formerly known as No Child Left Behind.
- Through Title I, we receive federal funding to support our educational program.

Why are we a Title I School?

- A school's Title I eligibility is solely determined by the percentage of students in the school who qualify for free or reduced lunch. When 40% or more of a school's student population qualifies for free or reduced lunch, the school is eligible to receive Title I funding.

How Can The Schools Spend Title I Funds?

Title I funds may be spent in five categories:

1. Supplemental Educational Materials
2. Technology Equipment
3. Additional Staff
4. Parental Involvement and Training
5. Professional Development for Teachers

Title I Funds will be used to...



- Purchase interactive technology



- Laptop/ computer carts



- Computer Tech



- Instructional supplies for teachers

All parents have the right to request the following:

- ▶ A teacher's professional qualifications, licensure, grade(s) certification, waivers
- ▶ A teacher's baccalaureate and/or graduate degree, fields of endorsement, previous teaching experience
- ▶ A paraprofessional's qualifications
- ▶ An annual notice of Student Education Records Privacy and notice for disclosure of School Directory Information
- ▶ An assurance that their child's name, address and telephone listing not be released to military recruiters
- ▶ Parent trainings

All parents will receive information on the following:

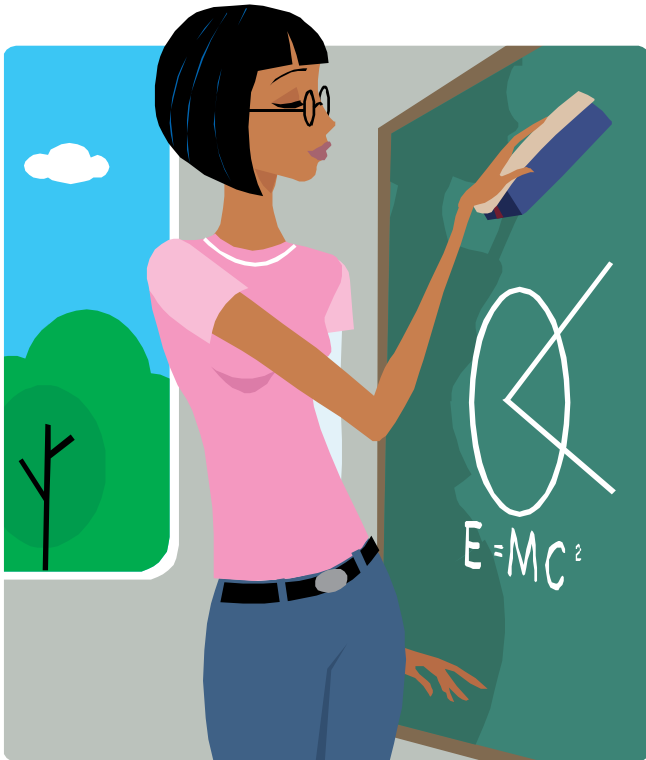
- ▶ Their child's level of achievement on each of the state's academic assessments
- ▶ Notification of right to transfer their child to another school in the district if the student becomes the victim of a violent crime or is assigned to an unsafe school

Reporting Student Progress

We use several avenues to report student progress:

- ▶ PowerSchool
- ▶ Mid nine-week progress report
- ▶ Report cards every nine weeks
- ▶ Parent-Teacher Conferences
- ▶ Telephone contacts

If your child is taught for 20 days or more by a non-Highly Qualified teacher, you will receive a letter of notification.

- Written document that shows:
 - School Demographics
 - Teacher Demographics
 - Attendance and Behavior Issues
 - Overall School Test Scores (TCAP, Writing Assessment)
 - Action plans to improve in areas needing to be strengthened
