WHAT IS TITLE I?

- ► Title I is the largest federal aid program for our nation's schools.
- The goal of Title I is to provide a high-quality education for every child.
- ▶ Title I resources are directed to schools with high poverty levels.
- ► Title I program serves millions of children in elementary and secondary schools each year.
- Shelby County Schools has roughly 190 schools operating under the Title I program.

TITLE I AND THE ESSA ACT GIVES THE PARENTS THE RIGHT TO KNOW:

- The school's status according to the ESSA standards
- A teacher's professional qualifications, licensure, or certification
- ► A paraprofessional's qualifications
- Academic services available for your child
 - That YOU can help by becoming involved in your child's education

TEACHER QUALIFICATIONS

Teachers are considered "highly qualified" under the ESSA ACT if they demonstrate subject knowledge in the core content areas, hold at least a bachelor's degree, and have been issued a license from the State Department of Education.

All teachers at South Park Elementary are "highly qualified" teachers.

South Park Status is a Level 3!
