



An assurance that their child's name, address and telephone listing in not being released to military recruiters.


All Parents will receive information on the following:

Notification of the right to transfer the child to another school in the district if the student becomes a victim of a violent crime or is assigned to an unsafe school.



Student Code of Conduct

The Shelby County Board of Education accepts the responsibility for establishing and maintaining proper standards of discipline and behavior in the public schools. What is IB-PYP?

The IB Primary Years Programme (PYP) is a curriculum framework for students in grades K-6 which focuses on the development of the *whole child as an inquirer, both in the classroom and in the world outside.*

We are one of two public Memphis-Shelby County Schools with the IB-PYP program. Oak Forest is the other school.

We focus on two things:

-- PYP Transdisciplinary Themes/Units

The IB PYP curriculum framework, or Program of Inquiry, is developed within the six transdisciplinary themes of Who We Are, How We Express Ourselves, Where We Are in Time and Place, How the World Works, How We Organize Ourselves and Sharing the Planet. We integrate these themes/units into our Science and Social Studies curriculums. Students complete one project each quarter.



When students are absent 2 days each month that equates to 20 days a year.


- 30 hours of math instruction over the school year

- Jackets and/or sweaters with or without hoods/ should be free of graphics and logos. (must be school colors only)


